Key Insights:

- National reconciliation requires both internal cooperation and constructive international support.

Policy Recommendations:

1. Establish Community Dialogue Platforms:

Local councils, civil society, youth groups, and women's organizations should be supported to initiate structured dialogue sessions.

2. Strengthen Trust-Building Mechanisms:

Repairing social trust requires transparency, open communication, and inclusive participation at all levels

3. Create a National Framework for Dialogue:

This framework should define objectives, stakeholders, timelines, and roles for all parties involved.

4. Promote International Facilitation Without Dependency:

External actors should support inclusive processes without imposing political pressure
